
1. Number of Incidents




- 49 incidents (48 actual and one attempted) during Jan-May 2020
- ☐ Almost doubled compared to Jan-May 2019
- ☐ Highest number of incidents among the past five-year period of January-May (2016-2020)



2. Severity of Incidents

- → 48 actual incidents during Jan-May 2020
 - ➤ <u>1</u> x CAT 1, <u>1</u> x CAT 2, <u>11</u> x CAT 3 and <u>35</u> x CAT 4
 - > CAT 1: 1 actual incident of abduction of crew
 - ➤ CAT 2 incidents remained fairly consistent: 1-3 incidents reported each year for the past five years
 - Majority (73%) are CAT 4 incidents (perpetrators not armed, crew not harmed)


