




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## ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report 5-11 September 2017

### **Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia**

#### Overview

During 5-11 Sep 17, two incidents of piracy were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. The location of incidents is shown in map below; and detailed descriptions tabulated in attachment.




Location of Incidents

#### Recommendations

The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia*.

The ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via the *ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert* dated 21 November 2016 to all ships to re-route from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the Sulu-Celebes Sea and eastern Sabah region, and report immediately to the following Centres:

Acting on<br>these inputs, the MMEA conducted<br>continuous monitoring of the ship and<br>dispatched two ships and a helicopter to<br>the location of the incident. The<br>MMEA's Special Task and Rescue<br>Team (STAR) boarded the ship and<br>apprehended 10 perpetrators who were<br>on board the mother ship that was<br>alongside were escorted safely by the<br>authorities towards Kuala Terengganu<br>for further investigation. Thereafter, they cut the wires of the ship's VHF handset and Inmarsat C-mini. The perpetrators also took the personal effects belonging to the master, chief officers, chief engineer, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Officer; and tied them and the other ship's officers in the navigation bridge and the master at the handrail on the ship's port side. The perpetrators escaped using a speed boat.
