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ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report 10 – 16 March 2020

Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia

OVERVIEW

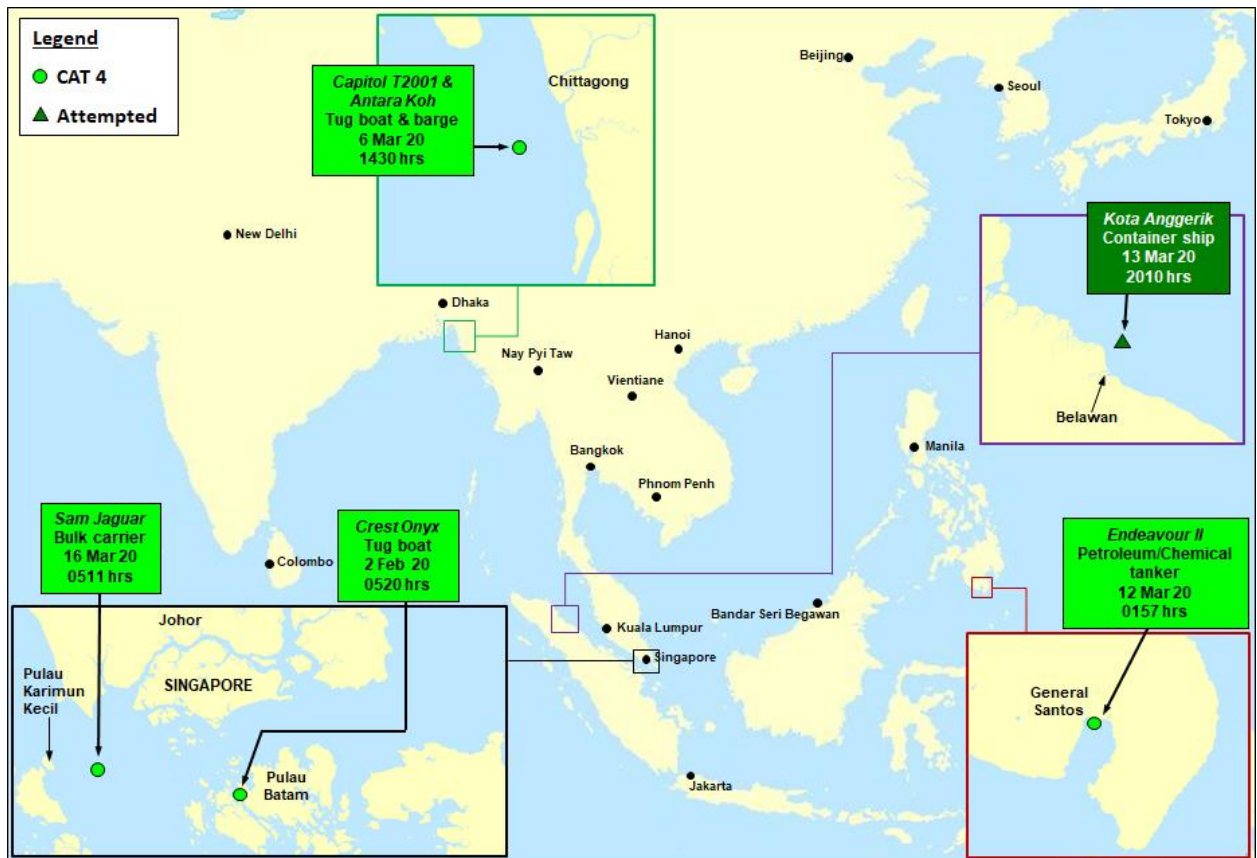
During 10–16 Mar 20, five incidents of armed robbery against ships in Asia were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. Of these, four were actual incidents (all CAT 4¹ incidents) and one was an attempted incident.

Of the four actual incidents, one incident occurred on board a tug boat while anchored off Pulau Batam, Indonesia, one incident on board a petroleum/chemical tanker while anchored at General Santos Harbour Anchorage, Philippines, one incident on board a barge while anchored at Chittagong Anchorage, Bangladesh, and one incident on board a bulk carrier while underway in the precautionary area in the Singapore Strait. With this incident in the Singapore Strait, a total of nine incidents have been reported in the Singapore Strait since January 2020, eight incidents in the eastbound lane of the Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS) and one incident in the precautionary area in the Singapore Strait.

The attempted incident occurred on board a container ship while anchored at Belawan Anchorage, Indonesia.

The location of the five incidents is shown in the map next page; and detailed description of the incidents tabulated in the attachment.

¹ CAT (Category) 4 incident is classified as “least significant” in nature. Under this category, the perpetrators were not armed, and the crew not harmed.



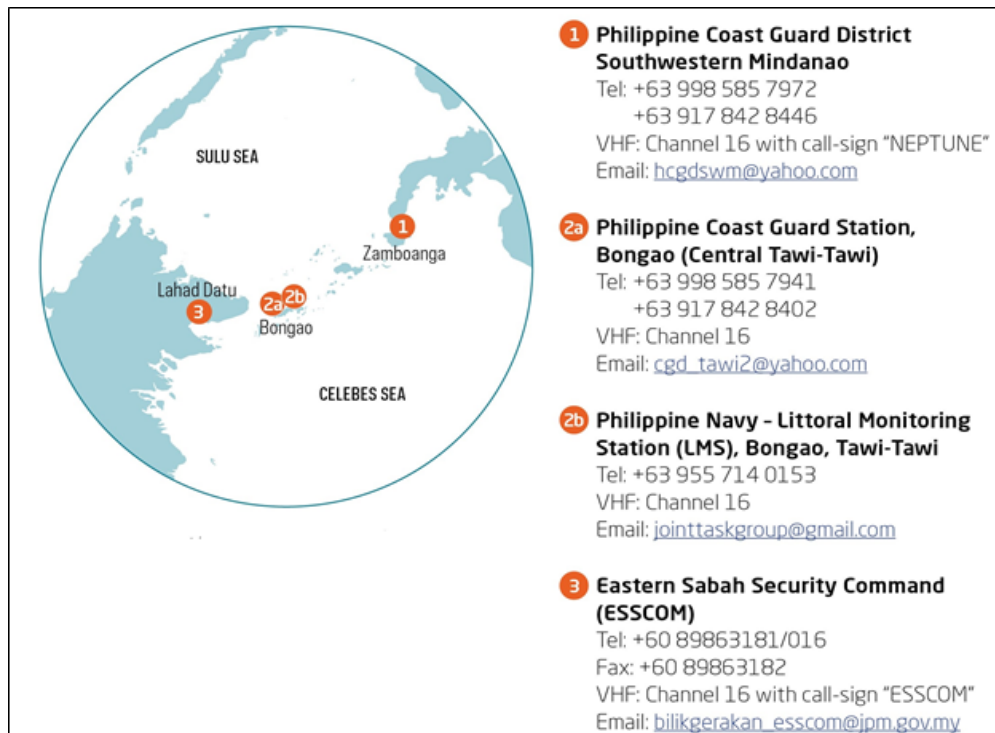
Location of the incidents

INCIDENTS OUTSIDE ASIA

During 10-16 Mar 20, two incidents outside Asia were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. The ReCAAP Focal Point (Singapore) reported an incident occurred to a container ship while anchored at Port-au-Prince Anchorage, Haiti on 8 Mar 20. The Contact Point (Hong Kong) reported an incident occurred to a general cargo ship while anchored at south of Port Lagos, Nigeria, Africa on 6 Mar 20. The detailed description of the incidents are tabulated in the attachment.

SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

As the risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah is high as demonstrated by the recurrence of the abduction incident on 17 Jan 20, the ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the area, and report immediately to the Operation Centres of Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. RECOMMENDATION

The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia*.
