
### **Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia**

#### OVERVIEW

During 25 Feb-2 Mar 20, four incidents of armed robbery against ships were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. All four were CAT 4<sup>1</sup> incidents.

Of the four incidents, one incident occurred on board a barge towed by a tug boat while underway in the <u>Kutubdia Channel</u>, <u>Bangladesh</u>; one incident occurred on board an offshore supply ship anchored at <u>North Anchorage</u>, <u>Kakinada</u>, <u>India</u>; one incident occurred on board a bulk carrier anchored at <u>Panjang Anchorage</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>; and one incident occurred on board a bulk carrier while underway in the eastbound lane of the Traffic Separation Scheme (TSS) in the <u>Singapore Strait</u>. With this incident in the Singapore Strait, a total of eight incidents have been reported in the Singapore Strait since January 2020, all in the eastbound lane of the TSS.

Location of the incidents


<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> CAT (Category) 4 incident is classified as "least significant" in nature. Under this category, the perpetrators were not armed, and the crew not harmed.

#### INCIDENT OUTSIDE ASIA

The ReCAAP Focal Point (Singapore) reported to the ReCAAP ISC an incident occurred to an offshore supply ship outside Asia on 26 Feb 20. The ship was anchored at Luanda Inner Anchorage, Angola when four perpetrators boarded the ship, broke the padlock to the paint locker room, stole paint and escaped. # SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

As the risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah is high as demonstrated by the recurrence of the abduction incident on 17 Jan 20, the ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise extra vigilance while transiting the area, and report immediately to the Operation Centres of Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia. The ReCAAP ISC urges ship master and crew to report all incidents of piracy and armed robbery against ships to the nearest coastal State and flag State, exercise vigilance and adopt relevant preventive measures taking reference from the *Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia.*
