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## ReCAAP ISC Weekly Report 26 January-1 February 2021

### Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia

#### OVERVIEW

During 26 Jan -1 Feb 2021, four incidents of armed robbery against ships were reported to the ReCAAP ISC. Of these, three were CAT 3<sup>1</sup> incidents and one was a CAT 4<sup>2</sup> (where the perpetrators are not armed and the crew not harmed).

Of the four incidents, two incidents occurred on board ships while they were underway in the Singapore Strait, one incident occurred to a ship while anchored at Belawan Anchorage, Indonesia and one incident occurred to a ship while berthed at Makar Wharf, General Santos City, Philippines.


With the latest two incidents reported in the Singapore Strait, a total of three incidents occurred in January 2021. The ReCAAP ISC is concerned with the continued occurrence of incidents in the Singapore Strait; and had issued an Incident Alert (IA 01-2021) on 29 Jan 21.

The location of the four incidents are shown in the map next page; and detailed description of the incidents tabulated in the attachment.

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<sup>1</sup> CAT (Category) 3 incident is 'less significant' in nature. Under this category, the perpetrators could be armed with knives/machetes or other items such as sticks or rods. The crew was not harmed although there remains a small possibility that the crew could be subjected to duress or threat during the incident but not harmed physically. In most CAT 3 cases, the perpetrators were unable to steal anything from the vessel, but in cases where losses were reported, stores and engine spares were commonly targeted items.

<sup>2</sup> CAT (Category) 4 incident is classified as "least significant" in nature.

## SITUATION OF ABDUCTION OF CREW IN THE SULU-CELEBES SEAS AND WATERS OFF EASTERN SABAH

The risk of the abduction of crew in the Sulu-Celebes Seas and waters off Eastern Sabah is high as demonstrated by the abduction incident on 17 Jan 20, information of planned kidnapping in Sabah and Semporna, Malaysia (as reported in ReCAAP ISC's Warning issued on 2 Jul 20), and the operation on 3 Nov by the Philippine authorities in preventing a kidnap-for-ransom incident. The ReCAAP ISC reiterates its advisory issued via ReCAAP ISC Incident Alert dated 21 Nov 16 to all ships to reroute from the area, where possible. Otherwise, ship masters and crew are strongly urged to exercise enhanced vigilance while transiting the area, and report all incidents immediately to the Operation Centres of Philippines and Eastern Sabah Security Command (ESSCOM) of Malaysia.
